

# What are Supplemental Educational Services?

Under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, Section 1116 (e), students from **low-income families attending schools that do not make adequate yearly progress for three or more years** are eligible to receive Supplemental Educational Services (SES). If funds become limited as a result of high enrollment, priority will be given to lowest-achieving students from low-income families.

School districts are responsible for funding these services, which must be provided outside the normal school day, through their Title I, Part A funds. The ISBE must develop and apply objective criteria to create a list of approved SES providers.

As required by the United States Department Education, ISBE provides assistance to districts with the implementation of the SES requirements and regulates the SES provider services.

## What are the Goals of SES?

1. To ensure that students increase their academic achievement.
2. To provide options to parents to help them ensure that their children receive a quality education.
3. To provide incentives to districts to improve schools in need of improvement. (ISBE Website)

There are 177 students at VHS who are eligible to participate in SES services for the 2010/2011 school year. The following SES providers are approved and provided to VHS by the Illinois State Board of Education, and the SES providers that are offering their services to VHS are typed in red:

If your child qualifies for SES, please read the provider descriptions to choose a provider for your child. If you qualify for services, you will receive a SES letter, a SES application form, and a description of each provider in the mail. **ATS Project:** ATS Project Success offers tutoring online in the student's home. Our program is available 24/7. The families choose a schedule that meets their needs. ATS requires students to work a minimum of 2 one-hour sessions each week for a total of 30 hours. Students in grades 9-12 use our Odyssey software by CompassLearning to work in reading or mathematics. The student will use the pre-programmed computer that is sent to their home for instruction. The tutor will monitor the student's progress online. All tutorial staff meets the qualifications for paraprofessionals to comply with NCLB. The ratio of staff to students is 1:1. If a child has a disability we can change and modify the curriculum to meet the needs of students. We are able to not only control the content of lessons within a student's program, but we can control the pace of lessons as well. We can also extend the response time for questions and prompts for a student with special needs. If a child is learning English, we will use a native Spanish-speaker who will work with our tutors to contact the Spanish students and parents. These translators assist with the weekly phone calls, and produce the weekly progress reports in Spanish. Transportation is not necessary, as we are an online provider. Website:

**Babbage Net School:** Babbage Net School is an in-home tutoring program that offers English and Mathematics lessons to students of grades K-12. Composed of 40 hours, Babbage allows students to engage in one-on-one, computer-based tutoring. The program is self-paced and equips students with a laptop that is preloaded with an individualized curriculum. In addition to receiving an individualized laptop, each student is supported by accredited tutors from the National Tutoring Association (NTA) and our Homework Help Hotline. **Consortium for Educational Change (CEC):** Tutoring will take place at Vienna High School District #13-3 on Tuesdays and Thursdays for approximately 26 weeks. Each child in the SES program is offered 40 hours of tutoring two days a week for 1.5 hours per session. We will honor all holidays and closed building times of the District. CEC offers Reading/Language Arts or Math for 9-12<sup>th</sup> grades. A student can only take one or the other not both. The curriculum that CEC's after-school program uses is Voyager Reading and/or Voyager Math. The trained No Child Left Behind highly-qualified tutors will be teachers from Vienna High School. Teachers will work with a group of 10 students per 1 teacher. A pre-test and a post test will be given to each student, and an Individual Learning Plan will be written for each student according to pre-test data. The post test will be administered at the end of the 40 hours to determine the amount of growth in the subject area. Parents will be given monthly reports. If computers are available they will be used to enhance the individual level learning. CEC will make every attempt to comply with the IEP with cooperation from the Vienna High School Special Education Department. **Grade Results:** Grade Results provides individualized, prescriptive diagnostic software combined with one-to-one, online tutoring. Our software comes from McGraw-Hill, one of the most trusted names in education today. In addition, we have formed an alliance with The National Alliance for Black School Educators (NABSE). NABSE is the nation's premiere non-profit organization devoted to furthering the academic success for the nation's children. Grade Results is easy for students and parents to use. When the student begins, he or she takes a McGraw-Hill PassKey pretest on math, reading and language arts that is aligned Illinois State Standards and the ISBE. The results of these tests become the basis for each student's tutoring plan. Students then go online and work on the PassKey content. When students have questions or are ready to review what they've learned, they connect with one of our expert, live, online tutors. Students can log into our service after school, at home, at the library – anywhere a computer is connected to the internet. No other material is required. We are available seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day. Students get a minimum of 30 hours of tutoring. Our tutors have years of experience teaching Title I students. Supplemental Services are provided before and after school during the school year, Saturdays when needed, and during the summer. Each student will receive approximately 60-100 hours of tutoring in reading and math. Classes are held twice a week in two hour sessions in small groups of 1:4 (teacher/student ratio). Summer hours are up to four hours per session for 4 to 5 days

per week . All tutoring sessions are held in safe, clean, and convenient locations. GSEC provides services for regular education, special education, and ESL students. **Learning 4 Today :** Tutoring will be provided Monday – Friday 3-5pm, Saturday 8am-12pm. Tutoring will take place on school site, community centers, libraries and churches. Students will receive tutoring 2-3 times at 1.5-2 hrs per week. There will be a total of 30 or more tutoring hours. The programs provided are SES after-school tutoring and K-12 Reading and Math. Tutor will use small group and on line. Qualifications of tutors should include a Bachelors' degree and a state teacher licensure. Tutor can help your child if he or she is learning English. **Reach for Tomorrow :** The tutoring will take place after school or on weekends as desired by the parents and students. We are desirous of using the school-based computer labs or we will look for community centers in the area that may have PCs and Internet access. The sessions will be 1-1.5 hours Monday to Thursdays, but we are flexible enough to create after school times that fit the families. We will target grades 3-12 in math, reading, and writing using a web-based academic program, Extralearning Online. This is a mastery learning program that integrates reading, visual, auditory, and hands-on learning styles. Each session is managed by one of your local teachers whom we will train to learn the program. Instruction is 1:1 as the program does the teaching. This is a web based program delivered online for small or large groups. The local teacher serves as the program manager on a 1:12 ratio. The tutor will be an IL teacher approved in the district. The program works for ELL and special needs students as long as they can sit at a PC and work. We do not intend to provide transportation for students and would like to use a late bus home if available or work to find a location in the neighborhood to support the sessions. **Tutorial Services:** All tutoring is completed online via the Internet. For tutoring use, students receive a new laptop with wifi available, but we cannot guarantee wifi in your area. You must have DSL/High Speed/Cable Internet Connection internet accessibility; we do not reimburse for internet cost. We recommend that students use our program 2-4 hours per week. We tutor students in grades K-12 in Reading/Language Arts, Math and Science. All tutoring is 1:1 via the Internet. We require all of our tutors possess a Bachelor's Degree and have at least one year experience working in the Education field. Many of our tutors are certified teachers. We can help a student who is learning English. The online program we use is called Compass Odyssey Learning and it has a Special English Learner program embedded into it.
